





DIRECTOR'S LETTER

Dear Friend of Saint Jude,

Thanks to you, we are restoring devotion to Saint Jude and Our Lady at this time when the Church is in great need of Hope.

You may have heard of the Holy Shroud of Turin, the Tilma of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico, and the Miraculous Veil of Saint Veronica. These images have miraculous origins; they were not painted by human hands.

The earliest paintings of Saint Jude depict him as bearing a cloth imprinted with the image of Christ (see front cover.) Later paintings make it appear that Saint Jude is wearing a medal around his neck.

According to tradition, King Abgar of Edessa wrote a letter to Jesus, asking Christ to visit and cure him. Jesus declined the invitation, but promised a future visitation by one of His Apostles. The promised Apostle turned out to be Saint Jude Thaddeus, who brought a painting of Jesus and healed the king.

However, a later version of the legend from the 6th century (Acts of Thaddeus) recounts that the image was not a painting but a burial shroud folded twice and then fourfold. Saint John Damascene also described the Holy Image of Edessa as a large garment. It is interesting to note that the Shroud of Turin has this same fourfold pattern. Centuries later, in 994, the cloth was transferred from Edessa to Constantinople. Emperor Constantine VII described the image on it as "extremely faint, more like a moist secretion without pigment or the painter's art."

Recent scientific studies reveal that the Shroud of Turin contains 20 different plant pollens that are from the Anatolia and Urfa regions of Edessa. These pollens are not found in either Jerusalem or Europe. There are excellent historians who have amassed a good deal of evidence making a strong case for the Shroud having been in Edessa.

So was the King of Edessa healed by a painting of Christ or was it the miraculous image of the Holy Shroud? Saint Jude may have carried both to Edessa or he may have simply folded the large Shroud so that only the face of Christ showed. If so, the most practical way for him to carry the Shroud at the time would have been in a basket. Perhaps this explains all the paintings of Saint Jude carrying the image of Christ's face on something round.

Whatever the case, we know that <u>Saint Jude</u> still carries out miracles in our own day, as you will read in this issue. And because of you, devotion to Saint Jude is spreading. During this month of November, we say a daily Mass for the poor souls in Purgatory who carry from their baptism the indelible image of Christ but still need our prayers to see God face to face.

Saint Jude, Bearer of the Holy Image, pray for us and all our departed loved ones!

SURVIVING CANCER WITH SAINT JUDE

I was very interested in your *Saint Jude Messenger*, which I received in the mail. I am named after Saint Jude. My mother was told by her doctor that she could not have any more children after my older brother was born. She made several Novenas to Saint Jude and became pregnant with me after praying that she would name me for Saint Jude. After many complications, I was born. Over the years, I have prayed to Saint Jude often, particularly during the three times I was diagnosed with cancer.


A LIFE LIVED WITH SAINT JUDE

I was praying so hard that Jesus would come to get her. I also prayed to Our Blessed Lady. I bent closer to my mom and said, "I prayed to Jesus and Mary to come take you to Heaven." 

When my father was in second grade he was diagnosed with

When my father was in second grade he was diagnosed with polio. It was the early 1950's, so there was no cure or vaccine yet. My grandmother, Philomena, was very faithful and had heard about Saint Jude. In Fall River, Massachusetts.

not far from their home, was a shrine to Saint Jude where a lot of miracles were happening, especially for the sick.

For two years, they travelled to the shrine every Sunday and prayed to Saint Jude, the patron saint of lost causes, for my father's healing. At this time my father had monthly doctor's appointments and wore a leg brace.

After two years of prayer, at an appointment on Good Friday, the doctor started crying. My grandmother

thought this meant the news was bad and she became really upset. Finally, the doctor stopped crying and said, "It's a miracle. Your son is cured of polio. There's no trace of the disease anymore, he's completely fine."

My grandmother attributed my father's recovery to Saint Jude, and my whole family has been devoted to Saint Jude ever since. My older sister and I both chose Saint Jude as our confirmation saint in thanks that our father was able to live.

Since then, my father has had many encounters with Saint Jude. For example, when he was a bus driver in New York City, someone walked onto the bus, handed him a relic of Saint Jude, and walked off. A LETTER FROM THE NEW DEACON OF THE ROSARY SHRINE OF SAINT JUDE, BROTHER NORBERT KELIHER, O.P.

t the Rosary Shrine of Saint Jude, where I am serving as Deacon this year, we are blessed to have a first-class relic of this Apostle. This allows us to send you pieces of cloth that have been touched to this relic, or third-class relics. Like all relics, these are reminders of Saint Jude's nearness and God's desire to help you through him. Relics, though, can be off-putting to people who are not familiar with Catholic belief and practice. So then, how do we explain them as part of God's plan for his Church?

The holiness of relics is rooted in the sacraments of our faith. A relic is a piece of a saint's body, often a bone fragment, that is imbued with sacred power because the person who lived in that body lived the Christian life fervently. The body

of a saint becomes holy by receiving the same sacraments that we do, especially Baptism and the Eucharist. When someone is baptized he is cleansed of all sin and made a member of the Body of Christ. Then the life of Christ is strengthened in him by receiving the Body of Christ in the Eucharist

over and over again. By the time a Christian approaches death, it is possible for his body to be sanctified to a deep degree. Sanctifying the body in this life is a preparation for its resurrection in the next life, where our bodies will share in the glory of the resurrected body of Jesus.

So why do we not revere the bodies of all Christians as relics? In one sense we do, treating them with respect and dignity in funerals and burials. But what makes the saints different from other Christians is their fidelity to the graces of these sacraments. Through faith in the power that Jesus offers in the sacraments, they struggle to conform their whole lives to Jesus by putting to death the remnants of sin in themselves. The saints recognize that Jesus uses sufferings to make them like Himself and help them to grow in divine love. Over time, these graces multiply in the lives of saints and they practice heroic virtues that make them stand head and shoulders above their fellow Christians. But these virtues spring from the fertile ground of the sacraments, and so they encourage others who also receive the sacraments to grow in virtue.

When we pray with relics, then, we should recognize that God wants every Christian to

> become holy through blessings through the use

the sacraments and the practice of virtue. The relics of a great saint like Saint Jude remind us that God never stops working in our lives, and that He gives us examples and intercessors to help us grow in holiness. God will also grant us favors and

of relics to help us in our struggles and strengthen our faith. Keeping this in mind, we can pray to Saint Jude: "Saint Jude, help us to understand the holiness that God wants for us and to receive the sacraments with fervor and faith! Our hope is to join you one day as saints ourselves, living in glory with you and all the saints around the throne of

God."

GOD NEVER LETS US GO

n May 23rd, 2008, I was ordained a priest of Jesus Christ. I like to think that my Nana—my Irish grandmother—is having a great laugh right now. She always hoped that I would become a priest. I thought about it a great deal when I was in high school. I even decided I would become a priest, in that half-hearted way teenagers make any long-term decision. But like so many young people, the lure of ambition and the prestige of the world pulled me away from the

Church. A career in the law became my goal, and God took a back seat, and I was content to keep Him there. But try as we might, God never lets us go. "Where can I hide from your spirit? From your presence, where can I flee? ... If I fly with the wings of dawn and alight beyond the sea, even there your hand will guide me, your right hand hold me fast." (Psalm 139) I think the same can be said of grandmothers.

It was a great sadness to me when my Nana died. It was April 30th, weeks before my college graduation—and I was to be the first of her grandchildren to graduate from college. But she left me

something very valuable; she left me her Rosary. It was not valuable in the way the world measures value, but only so in the way a grandson values the keepsake of a dearly missed grandparent.

It was valuable in another way, too. That Rosary was priceless in that it was like a cord passed from

God through my Nana's hands to me. Years later, after I did graduate from law school, as I began to embark on a promising career in a prestigious Chicago law firm, I discovered that Rosary again. But this time, I began to pray it.

As I did, God gave a firm tug on that cord, and slowly brought me back to Him. It was in that time of prayer that I discovered that as happy as I was being a lawyer, the Lord wanted for me an even greater happiness. And so, at the dawn of my

career, I left all the things the world told me were valuable, to serve God in his Church.

I have marveled that for everything I gave up in terms of material pursuits, I have received so much more in the spiritual benefits of ministering to God's people. While this is ultimately attributable to God's grace, I think my Nana's prayers were a part of it, too.

Some time after I became a Dominican—and after I took the name 'Pius,' after the Dominican saint Pope Saint Pius V—I learned a surprising fact. The Church celebrates the feast day of my new patron Saint Pius on April 30th, which is the exact same day my Nana left this world. I like to think that coincidence was my

Nana's way of saying "I told you so." So, if you were at my ordination, and you heard the echo of faint laughter, it was probably just my Nana, happy that I finally realized she was right all along.


